Spectators – Level 2

Nunweek Park:

Under level 2 restrictions we will be allowing a maximum of 2 spectators per player into Nunweek. Extra spectators are asked to watch through the fences from outside of the venue following government rules of social distancing. Please see a spectator viewing map below. CHA staff will be onsite monitoring numbers.

Under level 2 restrictions we will be allowing a maximum of 2 spectators per player. Nga Puna Wai 1 and 2 turfs will have split viewing areas. Spectators on turf 1 will have the grandstand area. Team Covid Responsibilities

Team warm up and down areas:

Nunweek Park:

- You may not enter your playing turf until the teams playing before have left.
- Immediately after your game you must leave the turf.
- Teams can warm up on Nunweek Turf 1 and use the changing rooms.
- There is a suitable amount of time between games to stop teams crossing over.
- Teams must warm down on Nunweek 1 or outside of the venue following their game.

Nga Puna Wai:

- Teams will need to warm up and down outside of the venue on grass areas.
- Immediately after your game you must leave the turf.
- Changing rooms will be open to use providing the rules below are followed.
- There is a suitable amount of time between games, so no teams cross over.
- Teams must get off the turf immediately following their game.

Changing Room Rules:

If you are using a changing room before or after your game at Nunweek and Nga Puna Wai your manager or coach must spray down the changing room touch points with sanitiser provided. A checklist and equipment will be provided in each changing room. CHA and council staff will be checking changing rooms after teams have used them.

If these rules are not followed by teams, changing rooms will be locked and will be unavailable to use.

Umpires

James-Paul Mountstevens is the umpires manager and will oversee the umpire allocations and to support the umpires as required.

Tournament Officials

Canterbury Hockey will appoint a Tournament Director.

First Aid & Physiotherapy

Teams are responsible for their own first aid. There will be no professional first aid supplier on site.

Ice will be available and located in the officials' dug out on turf 1 at Nga Puna Wai and in the facilities office at Nunweek Park.



For an emergency Christchurch Hospital is located at 2 Riccarton Ave, Central City.

For any other medical services Christchurch After hours is located at 4 Yaldhurst Road, Upper Riccarton.

Hockey New Zealand Under 15 Event Recommendations

The following recommendations have been made by Hockey New Zealand following association consultation and input.

Under 15 – ‘Explore the Game and Prepare to Compete’

Fun & Individual Development Focus

Relevant Recommendations:

- Meet principles
- Development over outcome focus
- Quality Coaching –maximise available resource/personnel
- Equal ability teams (not streamed by player ability)
- No Trials
- Minimise de-selection
- Minimal build up
- Build in social activities -ensure match scheduling enables this to occur i.e. opening ceremony, a social night, team challenges



Additional considerations:

- Uniforms optional (i.e. bibs as options) –consider providing attendee ribbons/t-shirts
- Provide digital engagement (photo sharing, social media presence etc)
- Positive engagement/experience for parents, guardians and whanau
- Consider parent/whānau education opportunities (i.e. Good Sports)
